I wish to express my sincere dissatisfaction of the way Kengen is dealing with Narasha community relocation process. The company has now accepted that they have plans for expansion of geothermal power projects to the area. This means that, their previous denial of being part of Narasha problems was a company's decision to evading laid down policies which were to be followed to acquired land.

We as Narasha community bring to donors attention of the following issues concerning Kengen;

- 1. Kengen through world bank, AfBD, European Investment Bank, Japan Bank For International Cooperation have put up an expansion project of Olkaria1 to which an injection well is located at the disputed land. We have asked Kengen to provide us with ESIA report of the well and drilling programme at our land and they have refused to give. It is constitutional for us to access important information in any firm which are affecting us.
- 2. Kengen in conjunction with Ministry of Energy has acquired funds for putting up Olkaria 5 and 6 and they have been pushing out people of Narasha without following the laid down procedure. I wish to categorically say, Kengen is not fully involving the community on the relocation process.
- 3. Indigenous rights, rights of minority, rights of children and rights of women are clearly given in the Kenya Constitution, World Bank policies, UN declaration of human rights JBIC policies, AFDB Policies. The donors family has an obligation to ensure all laid down policies are respected.
- 4. ESIA reports on Kengen projects are well documented including recognizing the Olkaria is an ancestral land to the Maasai. The gorge, the caves, the red/white ochre, the towers and birds have cultural and religious significance. Kengen should respect our religious beliefs.
- 5. We as Narasha residents as the donors family to push Kengen to recognise our right s and compensate us accordingly.
- 6. I wish to ask World Bank that, I have raised our concerns to you and we have not seen any Kengen good response to our discussion.

In conclusion, we as residents of Narasha are not against any developments in our area but our human rights should be respected
