

(% of GDP)






Expenditure as share of GDP, EU28 (2015)

(% of total public expenditure)







US/EA growth gap is from a combination of employment, IT capital and TFP







Investments: total and public, EU28 (2007-2018*)









EUR **4,500** bn p.a.



EIB lending to the Social sector 2000-2016


