Consolidation of Units

The investment process is going hand in hand with the process of integrating healthcare units in the Kujawsko-Pomorskie Region, i.e.:

In Bydgoszcz, the Regional Dermatology Clinic has been incorporated into the Tadeusz Browicz Regional Hospital for Infectious Diseases and Observation, while the Regional Dental Centre into the structure of the Józef Brudzinski Regional Children's Hospital.

In Toruń, the structure of the Ludwik Rydygier Regional Polyclinical Hospital has been expanded with the Regional Children's Hospital, the Regional Psychiatric Centre for Medical Care, the Regional Hospital for Infectious Diseases and Observation, and the Regional Ambulance Service Station.

In Wloclawek, the Regional Ambulance Service Station has been merged with the structure of the Regional Hospital.


The Programme of Investment and Modernisation Objectives for Regional Hospitals, in the years 2009-2020. "The Medical Package of the Century"

Value of the Project – 1,860,500,000.00 PLN

- The investment tasks that have been contracted so far belong to:
 - EBI I Amounting to 444.36 million PLN in total
 - EBI II Amounting to 3.1 million PLN in total
 - ▶ EBI III Amounting to over 336 million PLN in total
- Sources of funding:
 - ▶ The loan granted by the European Investment Bank;
 - ▶ The Regional Operational Programme for Kujawsko-Pomorskie Province, 2007–2013 and 2014-2020;
 - Own contributions of hospitals;
 - Budget of the province;
 - Other financial instruments.

Kujawsko-Pomorskie Inwestycje Medyczne Sp. z o.o.

- It is a special purpose vehicle established in 2009, by Kujawsko-Pomorskie Region.
- It carries out medical investments in hospitals for which the establishing entity is the Provincial Government of Kujawsko-Pomorskie.
- The investments carried out by the company are aimed at improving the standard of medical services rendered by provincial hospitals.






Principles of the Programme

- The primary objective is to adapt the infrastructure of the existing hospital facilities to the requirements of the Polish law;
- Improving the standard of medical services rendered by provincial hospitals;
- Modernisation of hospital facilities, including their infrastructure, and increasing the efficiency of managing energy resources, resulting primarily from the worn-out equipment that is part of hospitals' assets;
- Improving the quality, functionality, and aesthetic value of healthcare facilities;
- Equipping healthcare units with medical and non-medical equipment and

instruments necessary to render medical services.

The following seven (7) hospitals have been included in the Programme:


- ▶ The Ludwik Rydygier Provincial Polyclinic Hospital in Torun;

- ▶ The Kuyavian-Pomeranian Pulmonology Centre in Bydgoszcz;
- ▶ The Blessed Father Jerzy Popieluszko Provincial Specialist Hospital in Wloclawek;
- ▶ The Jozef Bednarz Specialist Psychiatric Hospital in Swiecie.



The development of the Ludwik Rydygier Provincial Polyclinic Hospital in Torun

On 17th November 2016, in Warsaw, we signed a loan agreement with the European Investment Bank, concerning the development of the Provincial Polyclinic Hospital in Torun.

The agreement amounting to the total value of 238.5 million PLN is the first agreement in which EBI used the funds allocated to the European Fund for Strategic Investment (EFSI).

As for the other part of the financial engineering of the investment worth over half a million Polish zloty, it includes money from the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF) and own contributions of the hospital and the provincial government.





The development of the Ludwik Rydygier Provincial Polyclinical Hospital in Torun

- The developing and rebuilding plan includes erecting a new main building that will be added to the existing building.
- Erecting new pavilions for the Hospital for Infectious Diseases and Observation, and creating six psychiatric wards.
- Erecting an administration building that will also house a new automated pharmacy.
- Building a four-storey car park.
