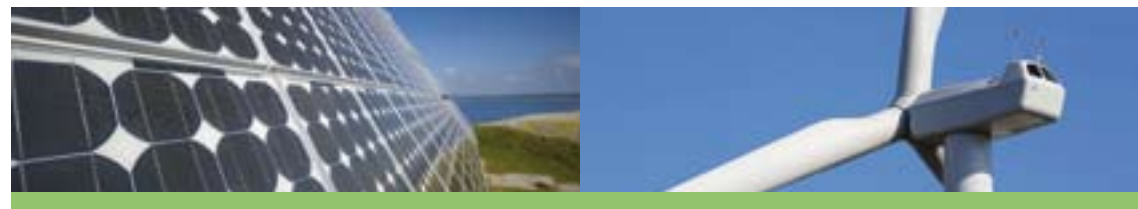

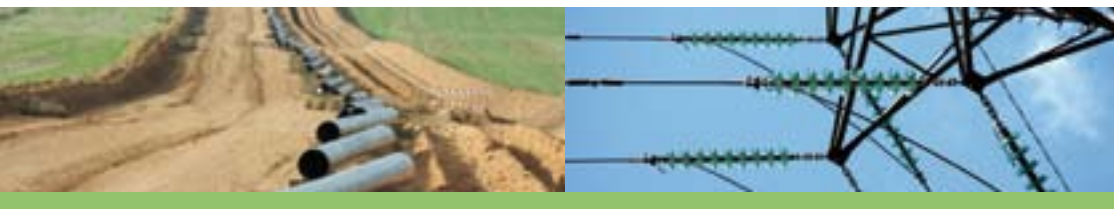

This session will look at major energy consumers, the automobile industry and its response to climate change, the steel industry and its efforts to increase energy efficiency, energy efficient household appliances including efficient lighting and, finally, the potential for energy efficient buildings.
