The Inclusive Finance Network Luxembourg Asbl (InFiNe.lu) was created in March 2014 as a continuation of the former *Luxembourg Microfinance Round Table*, an informal initiative since 2004. The uniqueness of InFiNe.lu is to bring together key stakeholders from the public, private and civil society sector in Luxembourg around the common objective of promoting financial inclusion. 23 members have already joined this network.

InFiNe.lu, capitalising on Luxembourg's leading position in the financial and development sector, aims to develop knowledge and expertise by stimulating exchange and collaboration amongst its members while consolidating Luxembourg as a center of excellence in the field of inclusive finance.

The European Investment Bank is the long term lending institution of the European Union, owned by its Member States, tasked with making long-term finance available for sound investment in order to contribute towards policy goals. It was founded in 1958, and has been active outside of the European Union since 1963. The EIB Group (European Investment Bank and European Investment Fund) invested EUR 80.3 billion in 2014, and is active in over 160 countries. The Bank has a long track record in microfinance and, as well as addressing financing gaps in emerging markets, also provides technical assistance. The EIB is a dedicated sponsor of European Microfinance Week and the European Microfinance Award.

### **European Microfinance Week**

The European Microfinance Award is held in the framework of Europe's largest conference dedicated to the microfinance sector, European Microfinance Week, which annually hosts more than 400 professionals at the Abbaye de Neumünster in Luxembourg. It is organised by the European Microfinance Platform (e- MFP) with the support of the Luxembourg Government and it gathers practitioners and policy makers from this rapidly evolving sector to discuss lessons learned and tomorrow's challenges.
