Project Description:	The purpose of the project is to reorganise and rationalise the service delivery of ETZ hospital, recently established as a result of the merger of two existing hospitals located in the Tilburg area. The main components of the investment plan are the rehabilitation and modernisation of existing facilities and the development of a new electronic patient file.

Summary of Environmental and Social Assessment at Completion

The project financed two main components:

- The rehabilitation and reconfiguration of existing facilities to consolidate 12 key specialities on either one of the main hospital sites.
- The development and implementation of new IT tools (electronic patient file) to better serve the clients as well as to improve operational efficiency of the hospital.

Regarding the first component, all the works have been executed within existing hospital facilities and the Promoter has confirmed that none of the works required an EIA. Overall, the modernisation and reconfiguration of the facilities has improved hygiene and safety conditions for patients and staff.

Regarding the second component, the Promoter has confirmed that development and implementation of the patient file has been done in compliance with the EU's regulation 2016/679/EU on data protection.

In respect to the energy consumption, the Promoter has committed to the Green Quest initiative to reduce both fossil fuel consumption and waste production before the end of 2020 by 20%. Approximately 7% of the investment cost dedicated for the renovations will be used to improve energy efficiency measures of the hospital. As a result, primary energy consumption of natural gas has been roughly 50%.
