#### **Environmental and Social Assessment**

#### **Environmental Assessment**

The Bank will require the Promoter to ensure that the implementation of the project will be done in accordance with the Bank's Environmental and Social principles and standards. Most of the investments and activities included in the project are planned to be carried out in existing facilities that are already used for similar purposes or are investments of intangible nature and hence are not expected to create significant impact to the environment. It is unlikely that the project will include any activities, which if located within the EU, would fall under any of the Annexes of the EIA directive 2014/52/EU amending 2011/92/EU in relation to urban development. The Bank requires the project's compliance with the relevant environmental legislation and with the Bank's Environmental and Social principles and standards. The Bank will monitor the project components with respect to their environmental and social compliance.

### **Social Assessment**

Through its health sector support in addressing the COVID-19 pandemic in Bangladesh, the operation strongly supports several NDICI objectives: inclusive growth, fight against inequalities, social inclusion and human development, gender equality, the development of social and economic infrastructure and long-term economic resilience of refugees, migrants, host and transit communities, and communities of origin.

The operation will contribute to SDG3 ("Good health and well-being"), as well as SDG5 ("Gender equality") and SDG1 ("No poverty").

The health care sector will be strengthened in Bangladesh, thus providing a sustainable environment for the population to remain in good health and participate in the economic life. Reduced infection rates will prevent unnecessary deaths, improve the health status of the population and will shield the economy from harmful lock downs that can exponentially affect the already difficult social and economic status in the region.

The project has a further significant gender element as women play a disproportionate role in responding to the COVID-19 virus, including as front line healthcare workers and carers at home and furthermore often work in the informal economy, which has been heavily impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Hence, the project, which enables (among other interventions) equitable and fair distribution of SARS-CoV-2 vaccines, is expected to significantly contribute to the achievement of SDG 5 ("Empowered Women And Girls") through the reversal of the negative economic effects that the COVID-19 pandemic has had on women and girls.
