Project Description:	The project consists of the purchase and delivery of up to 20 new firefighting and operation coordination aircraft and helicopters for the General Secretariat for Civil Protection (GSCP). The aircraft to be purchased consist of medium-sized amphibious water carrying aircraft, light amphibious water carrying aircraft, heavy water carrying helicopters, twin-engine turboprop aircraft as aerial operation centres, and twin-engine jet aircraft for first response and operations coordination, as well as associated equipment and training.
