### Overview

Project Name: Gdansk Municipal Infrastructure III

 Country: Poland  
 Project Description: Co-financing of mainly small investment schemes in the City of Gdansk, with focus on urban roads and infrastructure, and some elements of urban renewal.

### Summary of Environmental and Social Assessment at Completion

The investments fell in three main categories, including urban renewal (70%), urban roads (28%), and public transport (2%). All investments were small schemes below EUR 25m for which no need for Environmental Impact Assessments or assessments related to Natura 2000 sites. All schemes related to mobility contributed to the City's Sustainable Urban Mobility Plan 2018-2030 and the Gdansk-Gdynia-Sopot Metropolitan Areas Sustainable Urban Mobility Plan, which has been subject to an SEA.

The following categories of activities were involved:

*Urban renewal:* Revitalisation and modernisation of streets, parks, monuments and recreational areas, renovation and thermo-modernisation of public and historical buildings and museums, modernisation and construction of nurseries, kindergartens, schools, educational facilities, sports facilities, swimming pools, modernisation of social housing, and environmental schemes for landslide protection, and water and waste management.

*Urban roads:* Street modernisation and construction with emphasis on environmental improvements, safety and climate adaptation, modernisation of existing sidewalks, and construction of new bicycle routes and sidewalks.

*Public transport:* Improvement of public transport street features, information boards, and elevators.
