Project Name: Lublin Municipal Infrastructure II
 Project Number: 2012-0470
 Country: Poland
 Project Description: The framework facility concerns Urban and Infrastructure development of the City of Lublin in the coming years. Most of the project will be co-financed with EU grants under the new financing perspective 2014-2020. The individual projects should concern municipal roads, public transport, urban renewal, environmental protection, waste management, knowledge economy and other urban infrastructure.

Summary of Environmental and Social Assessment at Completion

EIB notes the following Environmental and Social performance and key outcomes at Project Completion.

The Project was structured as a multi-sector Framework Loan (FL) supporting the Municipality of Lublin (the Promoter) to implement the *Development Strategy of the City of Lublin 2020*.

At completion, the Project comprised the financing of eligible investments covering sustainable mobility (public transport and bicycle network) and the rehabilitation or construction of urban roads, urban regeneration, construction or rehabilitation of public buildings among which there were schools, kindergartens, nurseries, social welfare, sport and cultural facilities as well as social housing. The FL also included investments in environment (water and sewage) as well as in green areas and parks as well as the energy efficiency upgrade of public buildings (thermo-modernisation).

All the investments financed under the FL were considered as small or medium size ones, which cost was below EUR 50 million. Some of the investments financed under this FL and connected to urban roads or public transport (e.g. Integrated Communication Centre for the Lublin Functional Area, construction of the new road DW 809, etc.) were subject to a full Environmental Impact Assessment, performed in line with the EIA Directive 2011/92/EU as amended by the Directive 2014/52/EU. The schemes allocated were deemed not to have any significant effects on the species and habitats of Natura 2000 sites.

The Promoter was not to commit any EIB funds against schemes that require a full EIA or biodiversity assessment according to EU and national law without, prior to commitment, receiving the consent from the competent authority, and the Non-Technical Summary of the EIA having been made available to the public.

For this operation, the requested environmental conditions mentioned above were complied with and there are no further environmental or social issues to be reported on.

Summary opinion of Environmental and Social aspects at completion:

EIB is of the opinion based on reports from the Promoter and site visits by the EIB team during Construction that the Project has been implemented in line with EIB Environmental and Social Standards, applicable at the time of appraisal.
