Project Name: CHISINAU URBAN ROADS

 Project Description: Reconstruction of a selection of six major streets for a total length of up to 14.3 kilometres and the modernisation of public lighting, traffic signals and utilities in the city centre of Chisinau. Reconstruction works included renewal of asphalt and pavements, building of new central pedestrian areas and upgrade of water drainage infrastructure. The project also included the establishment of on-street parking facilities under a new parking charging scheme.

Summary of Environmental and Social Assessment, including key issues and overall conclusion and recommendation

EIB notes the following Environmental and Social performance and key outcomes at Project Completion.

The project implementation was limited to the urban area within the boundaries of Chisinau city, and no sensitive ecological receptors or protected zones were affected.

Negative environmental impacts were associated with air quality, noise and vibration levels and disposal of waste and were site specific, temporary and limited to the construction phase only. Some trees were cut, but to the extent possible this was compensated by planting new trees, so that the total number of trees in the city doesn't decrease.

As expected at appraisal stage, overall, the project didn't possess significant adverse social impacts to local communities or other project affected parties and no land had to be acquired for the implementation of the project, as well as no involuntary resettlement or economic displacement was triggered.

The project design and planning were organized in a way to ensure that businesses located in the marketplace next to one of the streets to be rehabilitated are not affected and that local communities continue to have safe access to and from their properties, particularly during the construction phase.

E&S conditions and undertakings noted in the ESDS have been met.
