The investment and business activities are not listed in any annexes of the EIA Directive 2014/52/EU amending the EIA Directive 2011/92/EU. The equipment will be localised and rented-out in existing facilities, already authorised, that will not materially change in scope. As such the proposed investment programme does not require an Environmental Impact Assessment.

Other Environmental and Social Aspects

The Promoter is accredited and certified conform ISO 50001, SCC (Safety, Health and Environment Checklist Contractors), ISO 9001, STEK (Dutch certification agency sustainable, quality and safety cooling techniques) and CO2 Footprint.

Furthermore, the Company activities cater for the circular economy, and its sustainability program – ensuring best use of machines, operating eco-efficiently by promoting energy efficiency, substitution of diesel-fuelled machines with hybrid or electric machines, safe and efficient use of chemicals, water and waste management – is central to its business strategy.
