Country of implementation	Spain	
Summary project description	The proposed operation is a funded participation agreement ("Funded Participation Agreement") between the EIB and Santander aimed at creating new/additional available lending headroom for SMEs and Midcaps, mainly located in Spain but also in other EU Member States.	
	The Funded Participation Agreement will be implemented in the form of a contingent loan that will cover the credit risk (principal and interests) of a preapproved, existing non-granular portfolio of mainly non-investment grade large corporate and Midcaps ("Existing Portfolio") originated by Santander. The underlying assets will comprise non-SME corporate loans, all of which will be internally rated. Neither Project Finance exposures nor corporate large infrastructure operations will be included in the existing portfolio.	
	The Funded Participation Agreement will provide Santander with additional capacity to lend to SMEs and Midcaps in a capital efficient way. As a result, Banco Santander will undertake to grant new loans ("New Portfolio") for an amount equal to twice EIB's exposure to the Existing Portfolio.

This pillar measures the EIB's particular contribution to the project and its financing scheme in the form of financial and non-financial benefits which go beyond what commercial players would normally be able to offer. This dimension of value added is assessed through three indicators:

- (i) "Financial Contribution" i.e. improving the counterpart's funding terms compared to market sources of finance (interest rate reduction and/or longer lending tenor),
- (ii) "Financial Facilitation" i.e. helping to attract private financiers (for example through positive signaling effects), promoting synergies in co-financing with other public sources of funds including National Promotional Banks or EU financial instruments,
- (iii) "Technical Contribution and Advice" i.e. providing advice with a view to optimizing the financing package (financial structuring), or technical advisory services in the form of expert input / knowledge transfer provided in-house by the EIB or in the form of assignments to external consultants to facilitate the preparation or implementation of a project.

Pillar 4 - Complementary indicators

Additionality

This project, with Santander Group, contributes to the EFSI objective to support SMEs and MidCaps by increasing their access to finance and improving conditions in Spain.

Thanks to EFSI, the EIB will support the investments of eligible SME/MidCaps beneficiaries. The project will benefit SMEs and MidCaps across the Spanish territory, including in cohesion regions (i.e. 20% of total financing).

SMEs and MidCaps are key for growth creation and employment in Spain, where the profile of the economy is skewed towards small companies, which represent 74% of employment. As small players, they have difficulty in accessing financing, especially long-term, and face higher financial costs (ECB data shows that Spanish SMEs pay around 38% more interest costs than bigger companies).

The operation addresses a suboptimal investment situation in the SME market segment in Spain, after Banks have redirected lending to bigger corporates or are unable to assume risk in already highly concentrated loan portfolios. The operation addresses this gap by sharing risk with Santander, allowing it to expand its lending to SMEs.

Building on an initial operation with Santander, and by means of a new financial product jointly created with the EIB, the project will allow Santander to maintain key products for SMEs-MidCaps and improve their financing conditions. All in all, the EIB intervention, with EFSI support, will enable Santander to provide additional financing to SMEs and MidCaps at attractive rates and longer tenors, which would otherwise not be possible. A minimum of 70% of the loan portfolio will be dedicated to SMEs.

The operation will qualify as EIB Special Activities considering the high-risk profile of the supported lending activity. Santander Group's position and experience in this market segment makes it well suited to deploy such financing.

The operation will release significant additional private sector financing, as it enables Santander Group to significantly increase its own financing capacity to SMEs and MidCaps, which will in turn invest further own resources for necessary investments in their businesses.
